6.1 **Principal's Report**

Principal Vigfusson provided a verbal report and indicated that four classes have been displaced as a result of the flood in the modulars during the Winter Break. Temporary classrooms have been set up in trailers in the school yard and repairs are underway. Radios are being used amongst staff members to ensure supervision of students as they move between the trailers and the school for washroom breaks.

Principal Vigfusson shared that a student was hit in the crosswalk on Broadmoor Blvd in the morning earlier this week. The student is uninjured and remained at school. The parking lot cameras captured the incident and footage has been shared with the RCMP, an investigation is underway.

Buddy activities have been set up and are being used provide students opportunity to work with students in other grades. The time is being utilized to allow teachers to collaborate on the new curriculum.

Information night was held on January 11 and was very well attended. Applications are being received from prospective students.

Numerous staff members are working on Masters degrees and a book club has been formed amongst staff members to help build leadership skills.

The Stakeholder forum is scheduled for January 23, 2023 and details of the event will be shared at the next Board meeting.

Principal Vigfusson indicated that a staff member sustained a chemical burn resulting from a cleaning agent used in a washroom. The staff member is doing well and recovering. An investigation has been completed and steps to address and prevent future occurrences have already been implemented.

6.2 Secretary-Treasurer's Report

Secretary-Treasurer Dundas provided an update on the recent flood, as included in the agenda package. The furnace quit working due to ice and snow build up on the roof vent. The sprinkler pipes froze as a result of the furnace outage and burst causing the flood. Future events can be avoided with diligent maintenance and removal of snow and ice buildup on the roof vents. Temporary trailers have been installed and are in use as temporary classrooms until the flood damage is repaired and classes can return to their regular classroom spaces. Discussion followed.

Flood Update

The drying is complete and the hygienist has been out to inspect and is satisfied. They have identified a small amount of mould on the bottom of a few of the floor joists where they touch the bottom metal skin. This is not unexpected and the hygienist has provided direction to scrub the areas and seal them with a sealant. This work took place last week, with a final air test to be completed to make sure there is no further concerns with mould and then the tenting can be removed.

The ordering of materials and construction will begin as soon as the tenting is removed. The only caution is that supply chain issues may result in a longer timeline regarding repairs. We should have this information in the next two weeks so we can keep the trailers a bit longer if need be.

Update from School Council Meeting

I attended the NHS School Council Meeting on February 1, 2023 as I was made aware some concerns would be discussed at the meeting. I confirmed with the School Council Chair that I would be in attendance ahead of time.

Some key discussion points emanating from the meeting:

- 1. The School Council would like to have members of the board attend their meetings.
- 2. Increase school communication to ensure that parents of children new to the school understand what programs are available for their children and what supports they receive.
- 3. Some parents believe we should not take students with behavioral issues and that we choose to take these students although their belief is that we do not need to accept them.
- 4. Perception that we are not meeting the charter requirements as set out in the NHCSS Charter.
- 5. There is a need for additional educational assistants in the school and or re-alignment of their schedules to support other students.
- 6. There is a need for more extra-curricular programs for students.

Resolution of these issues may be difficult to accomplish. Some can be dealt with through enhanced communications, while others such as believing we can hand pick students for admission to the school are incorrect.

The purpose of this item is to create awareness for the board about some of the issues brought up at the School Council Meeting.

Modular Update

Service Master has completed five days of heating the floor from below to clear all moisture from the floor of the modular. They have also completed moisture and mould testing to ensure everything is complete before proceeding with repairs.

Re: 2023/2024 School Year Calendar

Background:

The attached document presents a draft school calendar for the 2023/2024 school year. Administration's intent is to present a draft calendar to the Board for initial discussion and final approval. The draft calendar was sent to the School Council Chair and it was discussed at the February 1 School Council Meeting. The school staff also reviewed the calendar at a staff meeting.

Key features of the draft proposed calendar address the following pieces of legislation, regulation, and collective agreement articles:

- 1. Section 60 of the Province of Alberta Education Act establishes that "a board shall determine and make publicly available for each school year the days, dates and number of days of school operation."
- 2. As per the Funding Manual for School Authorities, and to allow for a balanced program that leads to the student learning outcomes outlined in the Ministerial Order on Student Learning, schools are required to ensure that Grade 1 to Grade 9 students have access to a minimum of 950 hours of instruction per year in each grade.
- 3. As per the Funding Manual for School Authorities, ECS operators shall provide access to a minimum of 475 hours of instruction for each child during a school year.
- 4. According to Article 8.12 of the collective agreement with the Alberta Teachers' Association, "Teachers will render service for the number of teaching days designated by the Board up to 200 teaching days, commencing the opening day of school in each school year, exclusive of vacation periods, weekends and general holidays of the Province of Alberta."

The specifics of the calendar are as follows:

- 1. The draft calendar provides for 191 days of school operation. Of these, 179 are instructional days.
- 2. The draft calendar is designed to be consistent, in substantial measure, with the calendars of Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) and Elk Island Catholic Schools (EICS), although not necessarily in perfect alignment. The need for consistency is prompted by our school's agreement with EIPS with respect to bus transportation services and by an acknowledgment that some families with children enrolled in our school have other children who are enrolled in EIPS or EICS schools.

- 3. As outlined in greater detail below, three of the non-instructional days are identified as days-in-lieu for "... parent teacher meetings related to report cards and Individual Program Plans," as per the collective agreement with the Alberta Teachers' Association.
- 4. Of the 179 instructional days in the proposed calendar, 169 are full days and 10 provide for early dismissal on staff meeting days. When combined with the school's current daily schedule, this generates a total of 960 hours of instructional time, which is above the minimum of 950 hours specified in the Funding Manual.
- 5. Classes for students begin on August 31, 2023 and conclude on June 27, 2024. These start and end dates are consistent with EIPS. Teachers begin their school year on August 29, 2023 and finish on June 28, 2024.
- 6. The draft calendar includes a Fall Break in November (incorporating one in-lieu day), a two-week Winter Break with students returning January 8, and a Spring Break (incorporating one in-lieu day) that begins on Friday, March 22 (Day in lieu for teachers), with classes resuming on Monday, April 2.
- 7. Additional holidays (i.e. those not included in other vacation periods) are Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, Family Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Victoria Day.
- 8. The proposed calendar includes 12 non-instructional days.
- 9. Intake Day (1) a day on which prospective students will be assessed for possible enrolment at New Horizons School; scheduled for March 1, 2024.
- 10. One day is assigned for the Charter School Conference that is held every second year.

Issues and or Other Options for Consideration

1. Too few instructional days:

If the board would like to increase the number of instructional days, November 13 is a day that could be changed from a PD Day to instructional day. This would increase instructional days from 179 to 180. These changes would not have any impact on transportation as EIPS is operating on those days. However, the impact would be eliminating most PD Days from the start of the school year as well as eliminating time for new curricular development.

- The board was asked to consider moving the October 6 IPP Writing Day to October 19, to allow for staff to travel to the Charter School Conference on Thursday. The conference begins early on Friday, October 20, 2023 so most staff would need to travel the day before or leave very early on Friday. This was completed at the last board meeting when the calendar was approved in principle.
- 3. Feedback from the School Council is included in the board package. Recommendations from the School Council included:
 - a. Preference for IPP Writing Day to be earlier in the school year. Recommend moving November 13 PD Day to October 6 and it becomes IPP writing day.
 - b. School Council supports the October 19 and 20 scheduling to enable travel and attendance at the Charter School Conference.
 - c. School Council recognizes that every two years, the Charter School Conference impacts the total instructional days. They would like to see these two additional days revert to instructional days for the school years with no charter school conference.

Dear Superintendent Lindquist,

In reviewing the proposed 2023/24 School Calendar (Approved Date: Approved in Principle — 2023-01-18), School Council has the following recommendations:

1. School Council is in favour of families receiving IPPS earlier in the school year than the proposed IPP Writing Date of October 19, 2023 would result in. Historically, IPP Writing Day is earlier, which allows for a collaborative team effort involving the student, parents and/or guardians, and NHS to support the student's learning experiences; therefore, being a beneficial way for all parties to start a new school year. If IPPS are not received until late October/early November, it is hard for students, educators, and families to set appropriate goals and expectations for the year ahead.

School Council proposes eliminating the PD Day on November 13, 2023 and moving it to Friday, October 6, 2023 for IPP Writing Day — this PD Day is in line with the EIPS Division Calendar 2023-24 and is consistent with the school's usual IPP Writing Day.

2. School Council is in favour of maintaining the proposed PD Days of October 19 & 20, 2023 and acknowledge and appreciate the impetus behind the selected dates. It is our understanding that these dates would be utilized for professional development as well as travel to Calgary, AB for attendance at a Charter School conference taking place on the 20th. While this biennial conference affects instructional days, School Council is in favour of maintaining October 19, 2023 as a PD Day with appropriate professional development opportunities for teachers to enhance their professional growth and, therefore, support student learning. October 19, 2023 also allows for group travel to Calgary as proposed by yourself — Superintendent Lindquist — and Ms. Vigfusson. With the understanding that all staff would participate in professional development prior to travel, and that the impetus behind traveling the day prior to the conference is due to travel safety and budgeting, School Council is in favour of maintaining the proposed PD Days of October 19 & 20, 2023.

School Council believes that staff and students would equally benefit from additional professional development opportunities for the staff at NHS. A consideration for the Board: Are staff offered professional development that includes appropriate enrichment opportunities for our students?

School Council understands that this biennial conference will affect the instructional days of alternating years; therefore, while the 2023/24 school year sees 2 fewer instructional days, we recognize that the 2024/25 school year will see 2 additional instructional days.

3. As per the proposed calendar, School Council is in favour of ensuring that EIPS bus transportation is available for all student instructional days.

4. School Council recognizes that some parents are concerned with falling below 180 instructional days (the proposed calendar provides 179 instructional days) which doesn't allow room for surprises such as illness or the 2022/23 flood and how these events impact a student's learning.

Ms. Vigfusson shared that since pandemic restrictions have eased, NHS has the opportunity to reintroduce strategies within the school day to allow for professional development in shorter periods of time — as well as more consistently. For example, "Buddy" activities allow staff to engage in in-school professional development while Div. 3 students provide leadership in a mentorship role. School Council is in favour of maintaining balance between instructional days and PD Days mirroring those established by EIPS, so that staff and students are equally supported in their education journey at NHS. School Council is happy to support Ms. Vigfusson in the professional development strategies that she would like to implement within school hours, since it engages students in unique ways and creates community within NHS while also offering opportunities for teachers to enhance their professional growth and, therefore, support student learning.

Re: Superintendent Recruitment

As the Board of Directors are aware, current superintendent Dean Lindquist has submitted his resignation effective June 30, 2023. The Board of Directors has now contracted with Dr. Leroy Sloan to recruit a new Superintendent for New Horizons Charter School. A meeting with Dr. Leroy Sloan was held to discuss the recruitment process on January 25, 2023.

The recruitment process has been agreed upon, and recruitment will begin soon. There may be required decisions to be made with regard to the recruitment process that falls between board meetings. As such, the Board Chair may be called upon to advise the search consultant or to make decisions. To accomplish this, the Board Chair will require authorization from the Board of Directors in a form of a resolution to serve in this capacity. This will enable the recruitment process to move forward without interruption. This may include meetings with the search consultant and addressing any questions he may have as well as responding to interested applicants if the search consultant requests this of the Board Chair. After the Board of Directors interview and select a new Superintendent, the Board Chair would also be required to finalize the agreed upon contract.

The recommended resolution is as follows:

The Board of Directors authorizes the Board Chair to act as the lead board contact for working with the search consultant and delegates board authority to the Board Chair for any decisions needing to be made regarding the recruitment process leading up to the board's selection of candidates and interviews and to finalize the hiring process with the successful applicant.
