- 7.3 Saffron Centre Booking: Advice to Administration on 2022-23 Booking
 - Option 1: PRESENTATION (\$150.00 for a 1-hour presentation) Cyberworld: What Happens When Youth Press Send? In this presentation, we provide parents and caregivers with information on the popular websites, games, and apps that are being used by children and youth. We discuss legal consequences and potential dangers online. We share helpful tips on starting conversations with their children and youth.
 - Option 2: WORKSHOP (\$300 for ½ day) Responding to Online Exploitation and Digital Literacy. In this half-day workshop, we start by providing parents and caregivers with basic information about safe screen time, social media platforms, and video games. We also discuss adult content that can be found online and how to talk to youth about it. Then, we will learn about the reality of online exploitation, what to do when we encounter it and how we can help support youth experiencing it. Lastly, we define and explain digital literacy, and discuss how teaching youth to think critically about what they see online will give them the skills to understand how to stay safe on the internet. This workshop includes a number of interactive sections on how to respond to a child who may be experiencing exploitation, and a scenario to test your digital literacy skills!
