4.1 Review of the 2024/2025 Fund Allocation

FANHS has approved a Fund Allocation of \$30,000 for School Council (SC) for the 2024/2025 academic year. Through discussion with membership, SC will reduce the proposal submitted on June 12, 2024 by \$3,250 to align with FANHS' approval.

In consideration of funds spent in the 2023/2024 academic year:

Classroom Support — Recess Equipment will be reduced to \$500.

School Support — Academic Support will be reduced to \$9,000.

A new line will be labelled as School Support — Extracurriculars with the budget of \$4,000 for Administration's discretion.

With no objection or further discussion, SC has successfully aligned the Fund Allocation for the 2024/2025 academic year within FANHS' approval. By unanimous consent, this Fund Allocation plan has been adopted.
